Beam trawls / Chaluts à perche / Redes de arrastre de fondo - de vara [TBB]

A beam trawl consists of a cone-shaped body ending in a bag or codend, which retains the catch.

A bottom otter trawl is a cone-shaped net consisting of a body, normally made from two, four and sometimes more panels, closed by one or two codends and with lateral wings extending forward from the opening. A bottom trawl is kept open horizontally by two otter boards. A boat can be rigged to tow a single or two parallel trawls from the stern or from two outriggers.

A bottom pair trawls is a cone-shaped net consisting of a body, normally made of two or four panels, ending in a codend and the net has lateral wings extending forward from the opening.

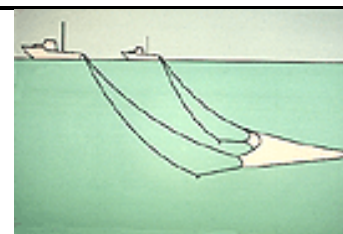
A midwater otter trawl is a cone-shaped net which is towed in mid-water and kept horizontally open by otter boards.

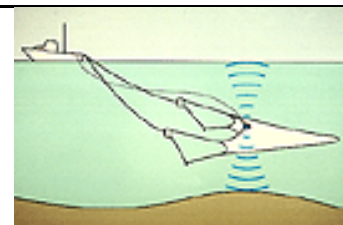
It has similar characteristics as midwater trawls used with otter boards.

A midwater trawl consists of a cone shaped body, normally made of four panels, ending in a codend with lateral wings extending forward from the opening.

Otter twin trawls / Chaluts jumeaux à panneaux / Redes de arrastre gemelas con puertas [OTT]

Otter twin trawls comprises of two identical trawls rigged to be towed besides each other, developed to increase the horizontal fishing area, particularly of species that are not herded by sweeps/bridles.

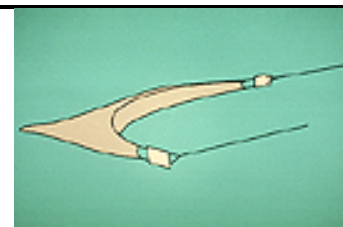
